PCJF 2012 Highlights

Armed Forces Navy Bus

In 2009, the Canadian Navy contracted Dymech to design and build three mobile recruitment platforms. The Setra highway coaches were retrofitted to travel to national, provincial and regional events and venues to display Navy promotional aids. The program was created to better inform the Canadian Public of what the Navy is all about and to assist in the recruitment of Canadians into the Navy.

The interior design includes three main areas: The Recruiting Process Area, the Action Video Area, and the Computer Area. The exterior graphics and an interior 3M window film combine to darken the environment to less than 10% visible light transmission.

Each bus has thirteen computer stations positioned along the sides of the interior. 20" touch-screen LCDs and noise-dampening audio stereo headsets are provided to access up to twenty-five scenarios stored on the computers in the computer area. These scenarios provide potential recruits with information on navy life including training and operations.

Sixteen 16" LCD monitors were installed along the overhead area of each bus. The system is designed to play the same program on each monitor either from a DVD player or computer. The screens deliver promotional information to visitors as they pass through the buses or wait for one of the computer stations.



Keynote Speakers 2012

One of her dreams is to open a homeless shelter in the heart of every major city in Canada to help and motivate the homeless to get back on their feet.

At We Day Winnipeg, Grace spoke on behalf of her school and won a ten day trip for her, four friends, and a teacher to go to a developing country (either Kenya, India, Ecuador, Arizona/Mexico, or China) and volunteer within the community there. Their hopes are that with their experience and knowledge after going on this trip will empower them to motivate others in being more careful with everyday life choices and to educate others on the impact every individual has on their global environment.
